Super Sweet and Sour Sauce

1 cup brown sugar

1 cup water

1/2 cup ketchup

1/4 cup white vinegar

1/4 cup apple cider vinegar

2 tbsp. soya sauce

Mix all together and bring to a boil.

Thicken with cornstarch mixture: 1/2 cup water

2 tbsp. cornstarch

Add to ribs, meatballs, chicken or pork. Yum!


